

FLAGS

Per Florida Statute 720.304 – Display of Flags

Any homeowner may display one Official United States Flag OR official flag of the State of Florida in a respectful manner not larger than 4.5 x 6 ft. AND one official flag representing a branch of the United States Military or a POW / MIA flag on the same bracket attached to their real property.

AND / OR

Any homeowner may also erect a free standing flag pole not to exceed 20 feet in height on any portion of the homeowner's real property as long as it does not obstruct sight lines at intersections and is not erected within or on any right of way or easement. The homeowner may then further display from that flagpole in a respectful manner one official United States Flag no larger than 4.5 x 6 ft. and additionally display either an official flag of the State of Florida OR an official flag of a branch of the United States Military or POW / MIA flag. Such additional flag must be equal in size or smaller than the United States Flag.

The installation of a new flagpole is subject to approval only to the extent to verify that it does not obstruct sight lines. It is the homeowner's responsibility to ensure the flagpole does not infringe upon an easement or right of way
